

Reaches Five Year Milestone
The CRAG (grant) provides funding to
Saskatchewan's community-owned indoor



FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN:

The Fellowship of the Least Coin movement began sixty years ago when the wounds of WWII were still sore and the victims of the nuclear attack on Hiroshima and Nagasaki were unable to forgive the allies. To seek reconciliation with the people of these war-torn countries, an international team sponsored by the Presbyterian church women in the USA were instrumental in setting up the Fellowship of the Least Coin movement. When offering a prayer for peace, justice and reconciliation each woman was asked to place a coin of the least currency of her country, in a special money box.

The Birch Hills United Church Women along with other local church women's groups have supported this movement since its beginning. Last year \$187.75 was forwarded to the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada.



These funds are part of the grants made each year for projects that benefit women and children The Birch Hills United Church Women invite all those interested, to an throughout the world.
