We need your help!

We are trying to raise \$25,000.00 to replace the Sit Tub at the Birchview Nursing Home. The present Sit Tube is very old and there is a high risk infectious control issues.

The Birch Hills & Area Health Care Foundation is a non-profit foundation that was formed in 1994 when our hospital was closed, the Birchview care home and Heath Center were amalgamated into the newly formed Prince Albert Health Care Region. The Birch Hills & Area Health Care Foundation was formed to keep control of the funds raised in our area for use in promoting health care in the Birch Hills area.

The foundation's role is to provide support for health related activities and the health facilities in Birch Hills & area, this includes the Birchview Nursing Home and the Health Center attached to it.

Our foundation is funded by tax deductible donations and bequests from local residents and supporters of our health facilities. Since our inception we have used these donations to support large and small projects, from the \$50,000.00 bed replacement project to supplying Broda chairs for the residents and &1,000.00 education bursaries to grade twelve graduates enrolling in a heath related field of secondary education. Currently we are replacing two air beds for the comfort of bed ridden residents to help prevent bed sores.

We have also supported the Rec board "Bridging the Gap" summer playground program, the Birchview facelift committee, the Birch Hills Fire Department, the Birch Hills First Responders and several other local health related organizations.

In the last ten years the foundation has donated over \$130,000.00 to support health care and healthy living in the Birch Hills Area.

As the Foundation continues to receive funding requests from our local health providers and other local groups we need to continue raising funds to support these very deserving projects.
