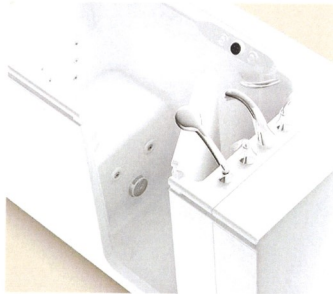

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

A public meeting will be held to discuss the proposed development of a non-hazardous municipal solid waste regional landfill in the RM of Birch Hills No. 460.

Date: August 21, 2019

Time: 7:00 p.m.

Place: Birch Hills Civic Centre - 126 McCallum Avenue, Birch Hills, SK

- process followed to this point
- preliminary site findings
- features and specifications of a modern engineered landfill
- benefits of the proposed development
- next steps

RM of Birch Hills Proposed Development:

Non-Hazardous Municipal Solid Waste Regional Landfill

Description: A commercial non-hazardous municipal solid waste landfill is being proposed to accept waste from the region surrounding Birch Hills in Northcentral Saskatchewan.

Project Details

- Proposed location is NE Sec 05 Twp 46 Rge 23 W2.
- Truck route will be south from Highway 3 (exact location is yet to be determined).
- Estimated number of trucks that would enter the site is six per day.

Site Details

- Preliminary drilling results of the site were positive, with glacial till being the primary soil across the site. These soils appear to be competent. Soil testing is ongoing.
- Topographic survey of the site has been completed using an unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV). The UAV lidar survey produced findings that indicate the proposed site would be appropriate for a landfill development.
- If the proposed development proceeds, it will be a state of the art landfill facility.
 - Site will be designed, built and operated according to Alberta Standards (Best Practices).
 - Site will be self-contained, including the following features:
 - Landfill cells will be constructed with compacted clay and/or geosynthetic liner to limit infiltration;
 - External diversion ditch to direct 'fresh' surface water around the site;
 - Internal diversion ditch and runoff holding pond to collect and manage surface water runoff within the site;
 - Leachate evaporation pond;
 - Landfill gas management system;
 - Garbage will be covered daily to enhance the success of litter control, rodent and odour reduction management programs;
 - Site will be fully fenced;
 - A litter control system will be adopted at the landfill cell comprised of a 20-foot-high meshing to contain windblown material; and
 - Site will accept and divert recyclable material, steel and compost material.

Benefits of Development

- Reduced waste service rates for regional members within the RM of Birch Hills and the RM of Invergordon, including the Town of Birch Hills and hamlet ratepayers within these RM's.
- Local employment (possibility of 2 to 4 full time employees).
- Support of local businesses, not-for-profit groups and local municipalities.

Next Steps

- Public consultation meeting will take place on August 21, 2019.
- Rotary drilling program to characterize the full profile of the site to bedrock.
- Detailed auger drilling program to define the character of the shallow geology.
- Development of the site design, operating and decommissioning plans.
- Submission of an application for a new regional landfill to the Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment.

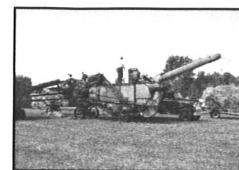

A BIT ABOUT YOUR MUSEUM:

Thirty-nine rooms, areas and buildings house over 4200 artifacts that have been catalogued, accessioned and computerized.

In 2019 seventeen members were elected to the Board of Directors which included a Town Representative and a Legion Representative.

It has been brought to the attention of the Board of Directors that several Directors will not seek re-election in the New Year. Their decision is strictly age related and has nothing to do with our love and dedication to your Museum.

The Museum is owned by the Town of Birch Hills and is operated by a dedicated group of volunteers which includes a thriving Thrift Shop and coffee room.
