



Emergency Management Organization (EMO) Coordinator Responsibilities

- Ensuring that the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) is ready for use on short notice;
- Prepare and maintain annually EOC Kits;
- Co-ordinate all EOC activities, including the scheduling of regular meetings training and training exercises;
- Ensure the Emergency Management/Response Plan is current and reviewed annually;
- Activate the emergency notification system through the fan-out list;
- Open the master event record and ensure that it is maintained for the duration of the emergency;
- Provide technical assistance about the Emergency Management/Response Plan, its procedures and resources;
- Ensure all directions from the Mayor/Reeve and Council are carried out;

Maintain a record of all action taken.



The Ecumenical Ingathering Service for the Fellowship of the Least Coin will be held at the Condo on McCallum on Friday, November 1 at 3 p.m. All are Welcome! We Lift Our Voices is this year's theme.

An offering of Least Coins will be forwarded to Women's Inter-church Council of Canada. Hosted by the Birch Hills United Church Women. The Fellowship of the Least Coin is an international ecumenical movement of prayer for peace, justice and reconciliation.

It began in 1956 when the wounds of World War II were still sore and the victims of the nuclear bomb attack on Hiroshima and Nagasaki were not able to forgive the allies. Christian women in the USA felt the urge to seek reconciliation with the people of these war-torn countries. An international team sponsored by the Presbyterian Church women in the USA was instrumental in the movement to pray for peace and reconciliation. They realized that practical action of peace was required and to bring this about they needed to build a peace fund. When women were asked to pray for peace and reconciliation they were asked to put a coin in a money box. It was decided that each woman should only offer the least coin of the currency of her country and there should be no competition about "who collected more". The poor village woman and her urban sister would pray and offer equal amounts. This was how the movement for peace came to be called "Fellowship of the Least Coin".

The International Committee for the FLC meets annually to make grants for the coming year, for projects that benefit women throughout the world. Grants for Canada are listed in the World Day of Prayer booklets. For more information the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada website is wicc.org
