This Seminar is open to everyone in the community, and is FREE of charge. It is for anyone who would like to learn skills to strengthen his or her relationships. We all need help sometimes





EARLY PAYMENT OF ANNUAL PLAYERS MEMBERSHIP

Pay your annual players membership by **April 15th** and avoid a possible increase in the new season.

If the fees are raised in the new season, the golfer will not be required to include the increase in their purchase.

This policy relates to annual individual and family players memberships only.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS OF ANNUAL PLAYERS MEMBERSHIP

To allow for the gradual purchase of the annual players membership through installments payments, those who elect to purchase their players membership for the new season, will be allowed to do this with a maximum 6 payments. The payments will start in **January**, with the final payment due **June 1**st.

This may be done by cash payments at the Birch Hills Recreation Office, money orders, cheques (Birch Hills Town and Community Recreation, Box 280, Birch Hills, S0J 0G0) or e-transfers to (<u>birchhillsrec@sasktel.net</u>).

If a refund is requested for any instance, an administration fee of \$50.00 will be charged and the balance will be refunded upon request to the board.
